In 2013, she directed her first feature-length animation film, *The World of Goopi and Bagha* (an adaptation of a 1915 story) for the Children's Film Society of India. Following the Toronto International Film Festival premiere, her film has been screened at numerous other film festivals in Busan Korea, MAMI India, DIFF Dubai and NYICFF New York, among others.

Ranade is a faculty member at the Industrial Design Centre, Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Mumbai since 2001. She pursued her M.Phil in Animation at the Royal College of Art in London.
