About the Exhibition:

"India has inspired Western fashion designers for hundreds of years, and this exhibition tells a small but integral part of that very complex story,"

says Helen Jean, Curator of the exhibition, *India: Fashion's Muse* at the Phoenix Art Museum.

The inspiration for launching this special exhibition, highlighting Indian and India-inspired fashion was sparked by the curator's long-time personal interest. Helen's passion is combined with the fact that the Phoenix Art Museum is dedicating a portion of their Asian Art Gallery to Sikh artworks.

Spanning 19th to 21st centuries, the exhibition showcases nearly 40 garments and more than 20 accessories drawn from the Phoenix Art Museum collection, and includes works on loan from private collectors and museums. Featured designs include the paisley shawl, vintage and contemporary interpretations of the sari, menswear including the Nehru jacket, and the Sikh turban. Traditional Indian garments are exhibited alongside modern works by Indian fashion designers, in particular, Anamika Khanna and Western designers such as McQueen, Givenchy, Versace and more.

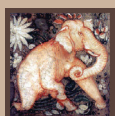
The exhibition culminates with stunning displays by contemporary Indian designers. Their innovative merging of exquisite ancient craft and 21st century technology and aesthetics is re-defining styles for a global audience.



Helen Jean is the newly appointed Jacquie Dorrance Curator of Fashion Design at the Phoenix Art Museum. Prior to her curatorial appointment, she served as interim curator of fashion design since September 2019. Helen first joined the Museum's fashion design department in 2007-2012 as curatorial assistant, and thus brings more than a decade of experience as a fashion scholar and educator. In her most recent endeavor, she curated the Museum's latest fashion design exhibition, *India: Fashion's Muse*.

Helen holds a BFA in Fashion Design from Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri, and MFA in Costume Design from the University of Nebraska.
