



Shanti and the Knot of Protection: A Rakhi Story is a beautiful children's picture book that helps all children understand why and how Rakhi is celebrated across South Asia. Discover historical tales about the origins of Rakhi from a queen centuries ago, who needed protection from a neighboring king, to modern times where it is celebrated by siblings that are brothers and sisters, siblings that are both girls or both boys, children without siblings, and even cousins and friends!
