Nilima Sheikh, a renowned Indian artist based in Baroda (now Vadodara), has produced a magnificient body of work over a five-decade career. Her painting exemplifies her mastery in blending technical skills with powerful narrative and a contemporary vision. Her bodies of work evoke mystical imaginary landscapes that address feminine experiences, touching on home, displacement, violence, loss, longing.

Besides her long engagement with feminist realities, the complex political situation of the Kashmir region has been at the heart of Sheikh's work over the past 20 years. Her delicate landscapes interweave oral and visual narratives with harsh contemporary realities, reflecting racial and gender abuse. By activating the poetic beauty of the landscape to communicate the urgent political circumstances of our time, Nilima Sheikh's work brings new meaning to bear on the layered history - both of her own time, and from the past.

Madhuvanti Ghose is the inaugural Alsdorf Associate Curator of Indian, Southeast Asian and Himalayan Art at the Art Institute of Chicago where she is responsible for the exhibition, collection, preservation and research of the museum's permanent collections in these areas.

Since joining the museum in 2007, she has curated and organized a series of exhibitions on various aspects of Indian art.

Dr. Ghose led the Vivekananda Memorial Program for Museum Excellence (2012–16), designed to foster professional exchanges between the Art Institute and various museums in India.

Ghose was previously Lecturer in South Asian Art and Archaeology at the School of Oriental and African Studies, London. She completed her doctoral dissertation from the University of London and was a Research Fellow at the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford University.
